The Dialogue formed the first Parliamentary Caucus for National Reconciliation in October 2010. In May, 2011 the Caucus, constituted by 22 well-known MPs and political leaders, launched its Action Plan For National Reconciliation, in the presence and with the endorsement of the Iraqi Government and the Presidency of the Parliament. The Iraqi Dialogue was financed by the Italian Ministry of Foreign Affairs-DGPAS.
